Introduction

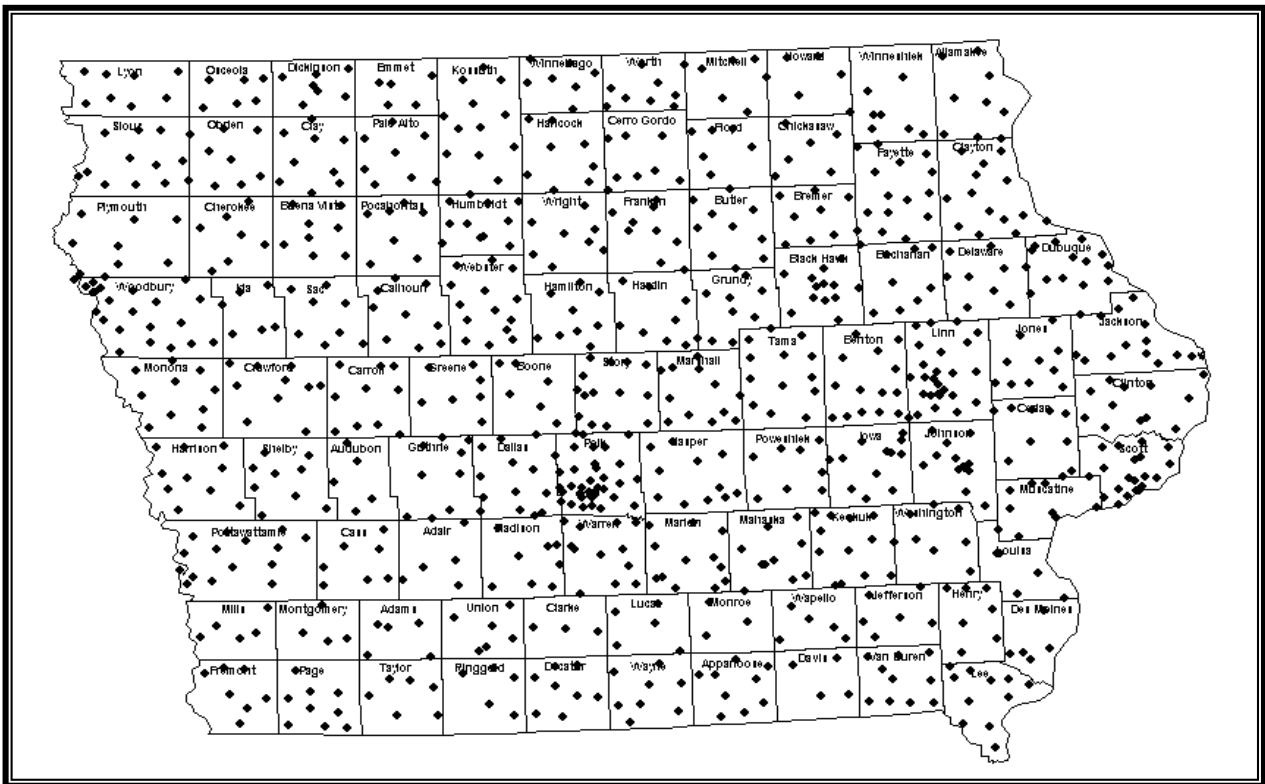
Iowa's 13 Area Agencies on Aging are responsible for tracking and reporting on services provided to aging citizens of Iowa funded through Federal and State programs. After collecting detailed information on the services provided, recipients of the services, providers of the services, and the associated costs, the Iowa Department on Aging (IDA) is responsible for filing an annual State Performance Report (SPR) with the Administration of Aging. There were a total of **70,663** unduplicated clients reported to INAPIS during SFY2010.

This report shows the number of older Iowans and units of service by service category from Title III funding of the Older Americans Act, through the Administration on Aging (AoA), the Iowa Senior Living Trust Fund and limited state general fund dollars.

IDA hopes that this document and the information contained within can be a useful tool for making informed planning decisions. The information provided in this report is the result of hard work and dedication from the Iowa Aging Network who work as a team with IDA toward the mission: "To provide advocacy, educational, prevention and health promotion services for older Iowans, their families and caregivers".

INAPIS Data

INAPIS data is reported to IDA from AAAs and this report represents information about clients and services provided from July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010. INAPIS data is dynamic and any corrections by the AAA at the local level after August 18, 2010 would not be reflected in this report.

The following definitions will assist you in using this document:

General Aging Program: Elderly persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through Title III funding of the Older Americans Act, the Administration on Aging (AoA) and other funding (Federal, State, Local, etc.).

Senior Living Program (SLP): Elderly persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through the Senior Living Trust Fund.

Family Care Giver: Persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through the Title III-E Family Caregiver Program and other funding (Federal, State, Local, etc.).

Clients: Eligible persons that receive services/benefits from programs offered through public funding (Federal, State, Local, etc.).

Services: A form of benefit received by the client; service can be recorded by individual clients or aggregate clients (tracks service delivery to a number of nonspecific clients); service tracking can include but is not limited to: Title III services defined by Administration on Aging (AoA); Senior Living Trust Funding (SLP services); and Title III-E Caregiver services.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS): The combination of all the personal services that are combined to keep an older individual in their home in their community. Such services are personal care, homemaker, chore, home delivered meals, day care/ adult day health, case management, congregate meals, nutrition counseling, assisted transportation, transportation, legal assistance, home repair, health screening/wellness, preventive health, respite, emergency/response system, medication management, adult/consumer protection, protective payee, reassurance, visiting, counseling, placement service, assessment/intervention and material aid.

Registered Service: Services that require a INAPIS client registration containing a "detailed" profile of client characteristics that include:

- Minority status, by individual minority group
- Age group
- ADL/IADL status
- Sex
- Rural status
- Live alone status
- Poverty status

IDA encourages client registration for all services but requires client registration for 9 of the 14 AOA core services that include:

- Personal Care
- Homemaker
- Chore
- Home Delivered Meals
- Day Care/Adult Day Health
- Case Management
- Congregate Meals
- Nutrition Counseling
- Assisted Transportation

and all services funded through the Senior Living Trust Fund and Title III funds designated by IDA as a required registered service with the exception of Legal Services.

Note: Based on Federal Guidelines services cannot be denied to a client who refuses to complete a client registration for General Aging and Family Caregiver programs.

Aggregate Service: Services that do not require a INAPIS client registration containing a "detailed" profile of client characteristics and are entered as an aggregate total of clients that received a service.

Service Unit: Description of how the service is delivered and recorded into the INAPIS system (i.e. hour, contact, session).

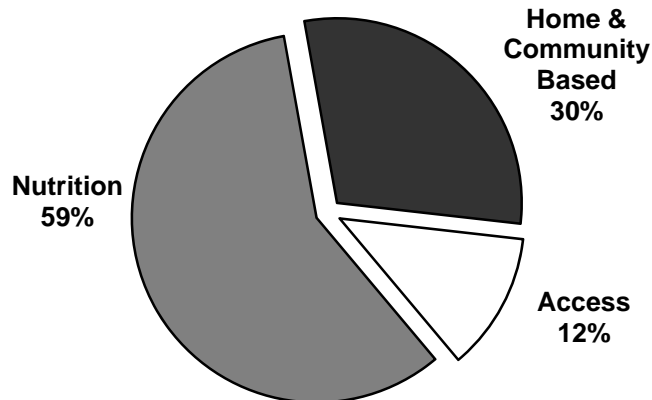

88% of High Nutrition Risk clients answered yes to "I take 3 or more different prescribed or over-the-counter drugs a day".

79% of High Nutrition Risk clients reported they maintained or improved their Nutrition Risk Score.

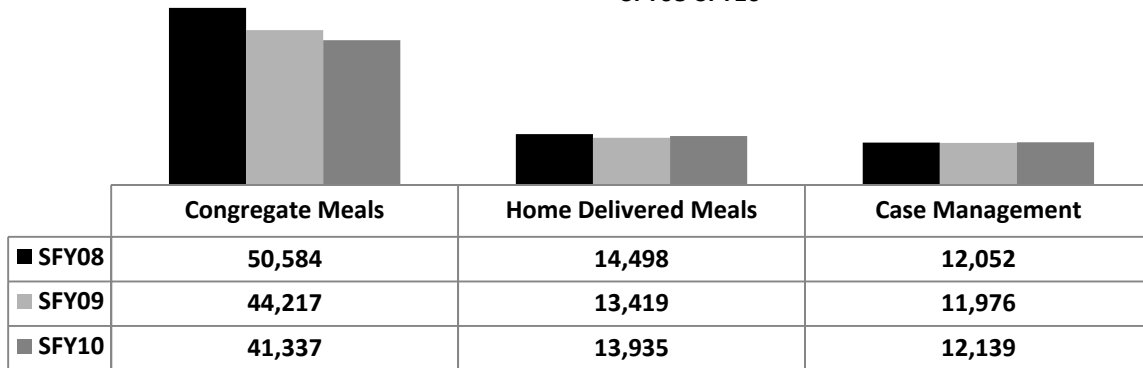

SFY 2008 – 2010 Registered Client & Unit Comparison for 14 Core Services

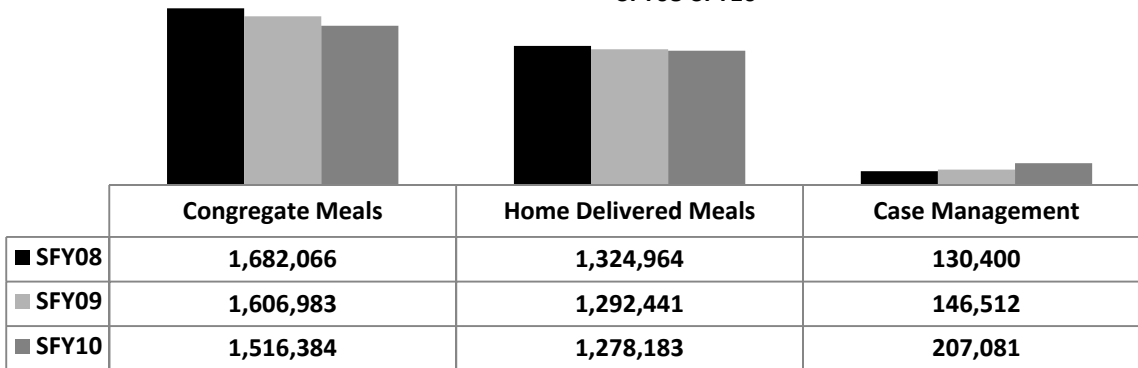
Chart 2: Unduplicated Client Count

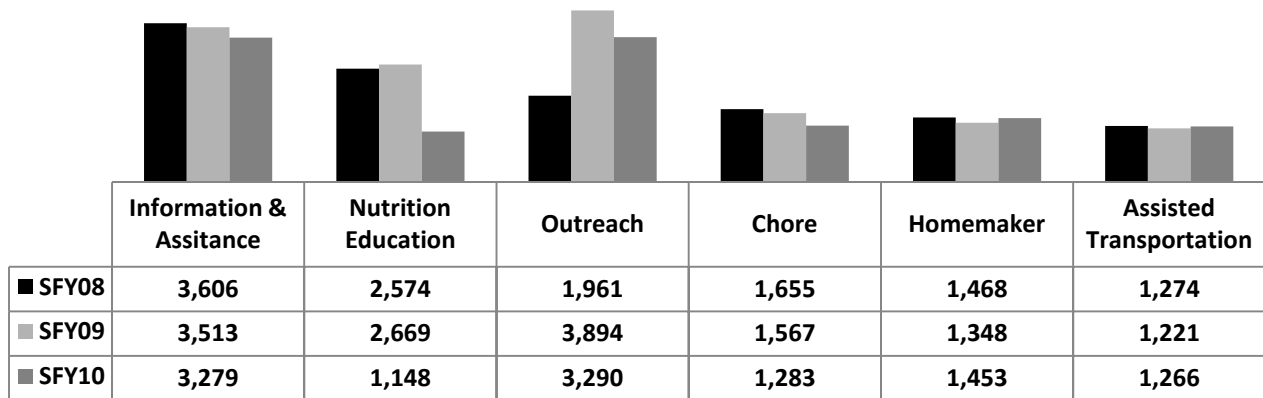

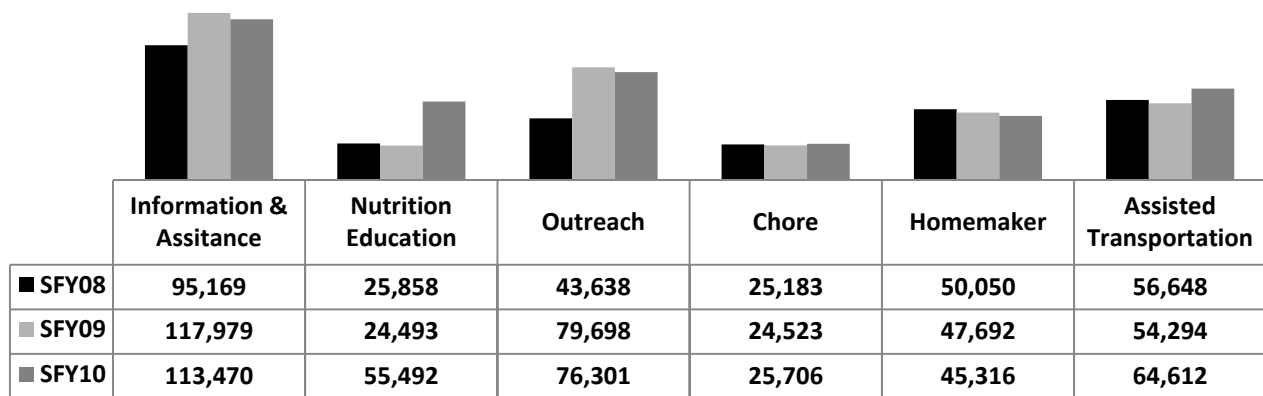
Chart 4: Unduplicated Client Count

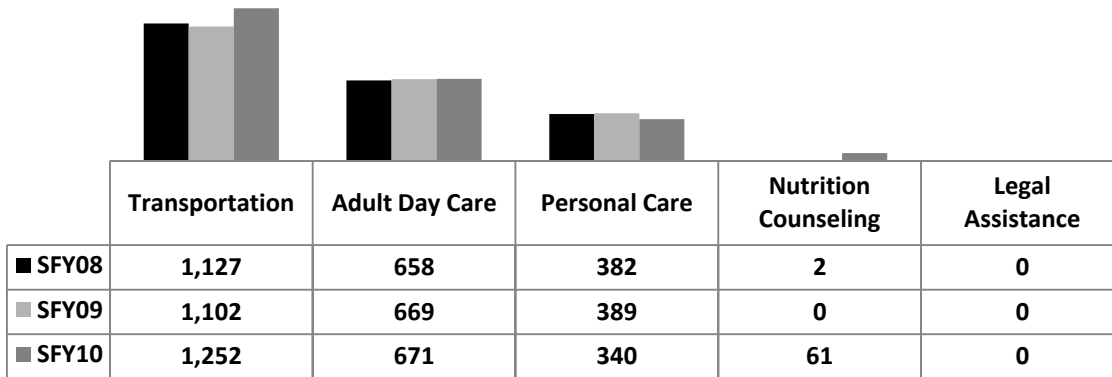

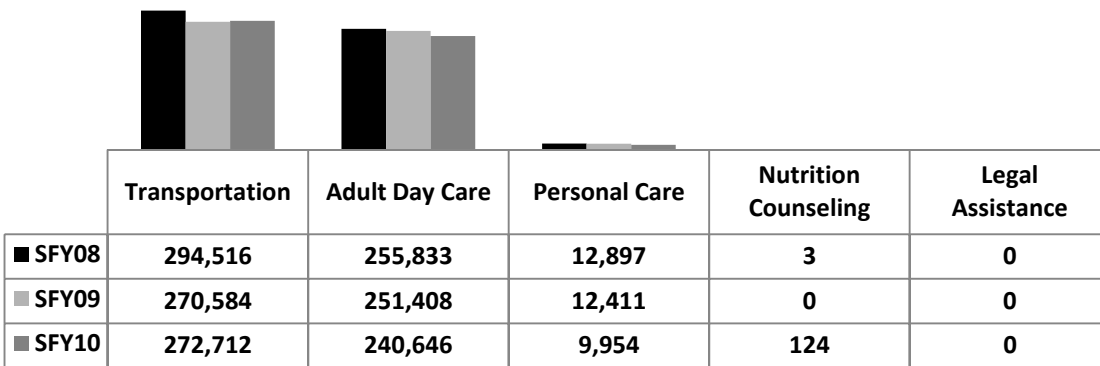
Chart 6: Unduplicated Client Count

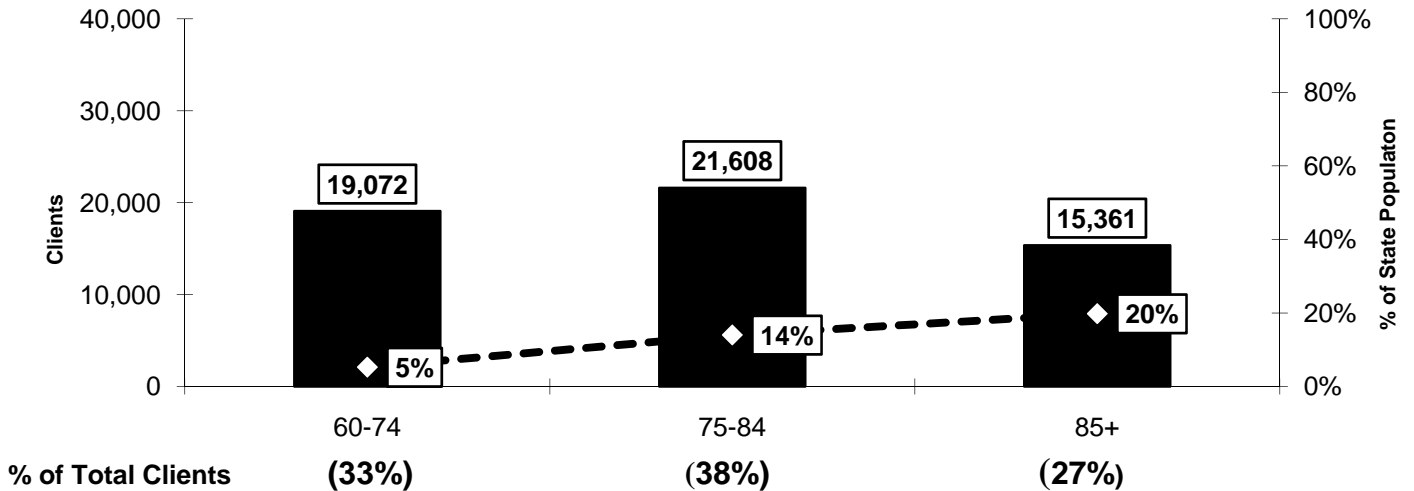

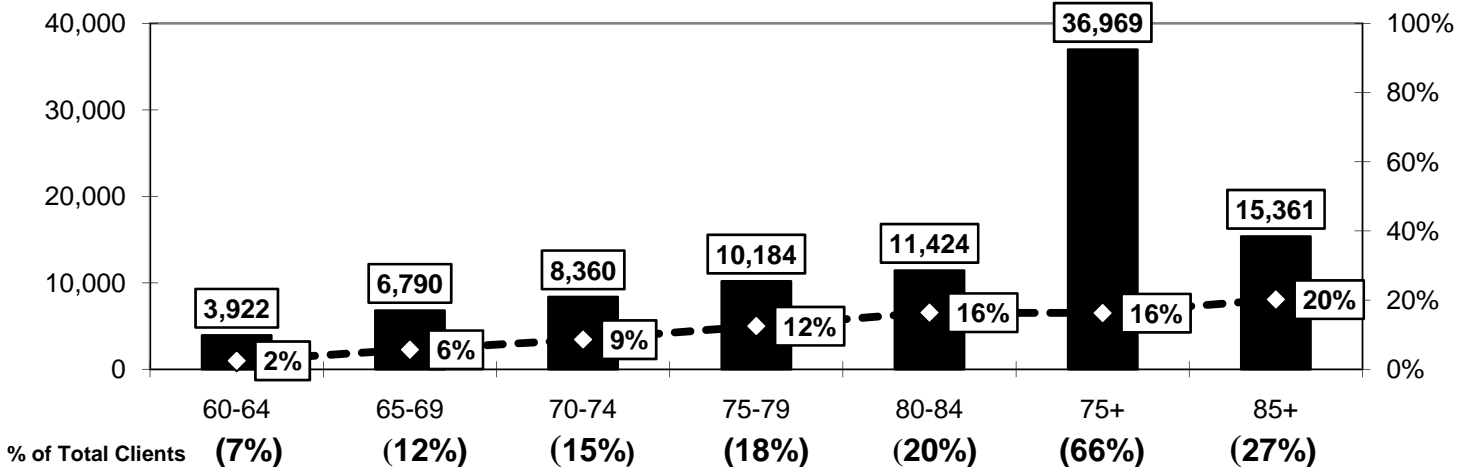

5 year Age Groups

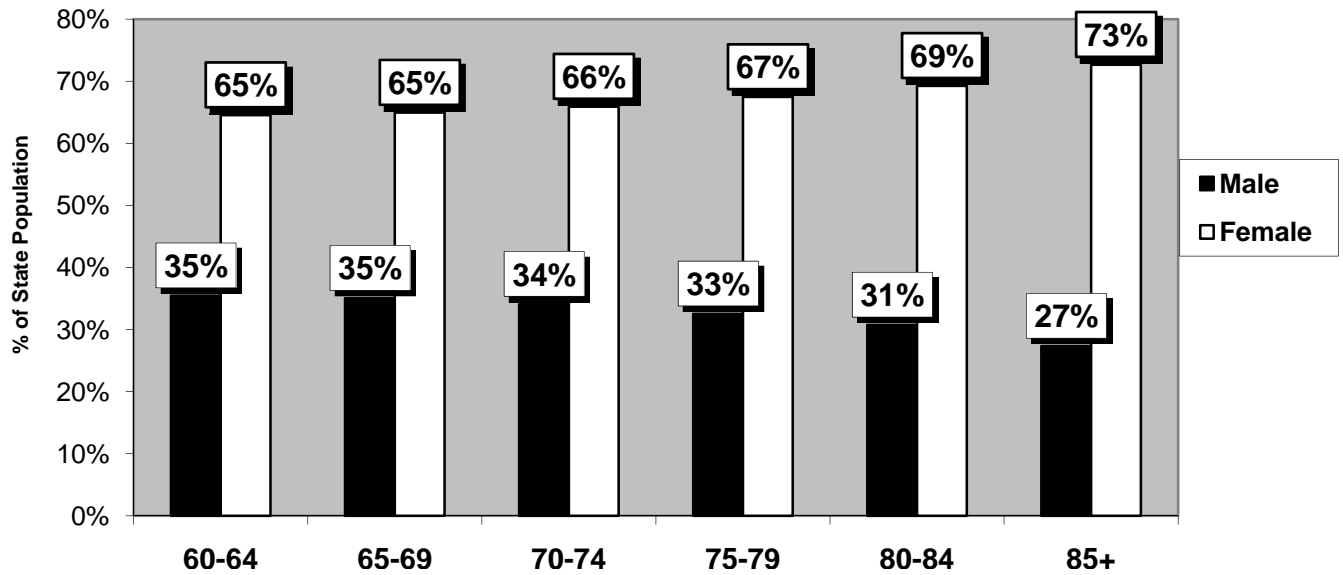

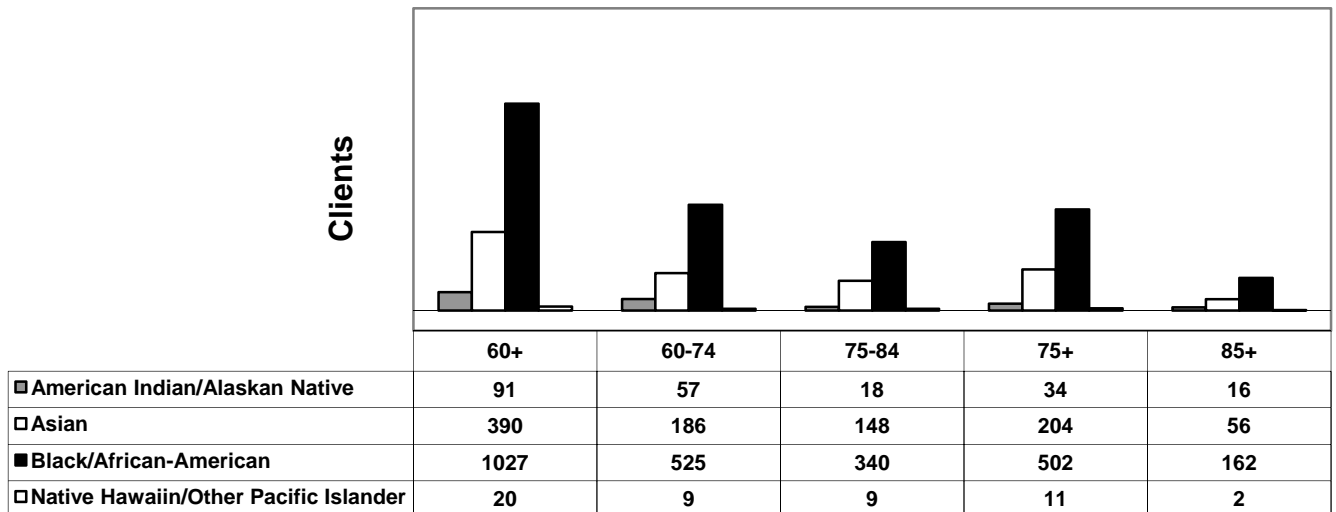
SFY 2010 Client Characteristics - Age Group, Gender, Race and Ethnicity Status

Chart 10: Unduplicated Minority Client Count of Race Type and Age Group

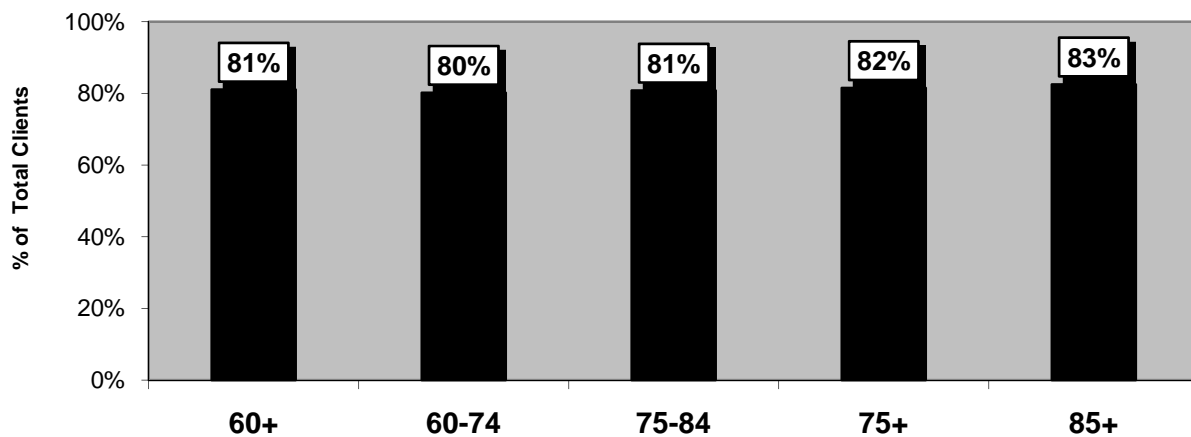

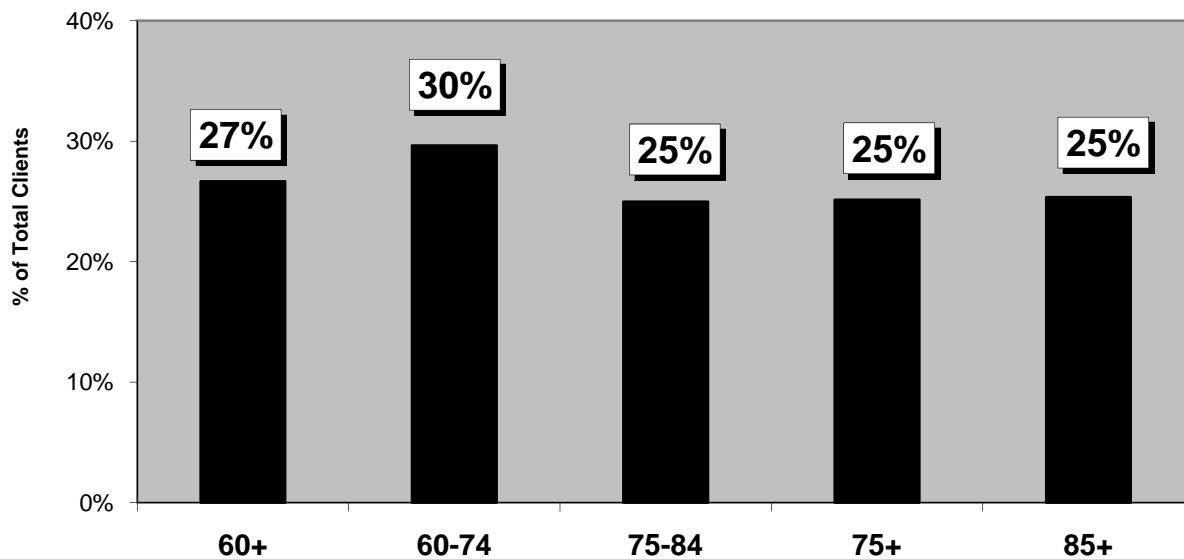

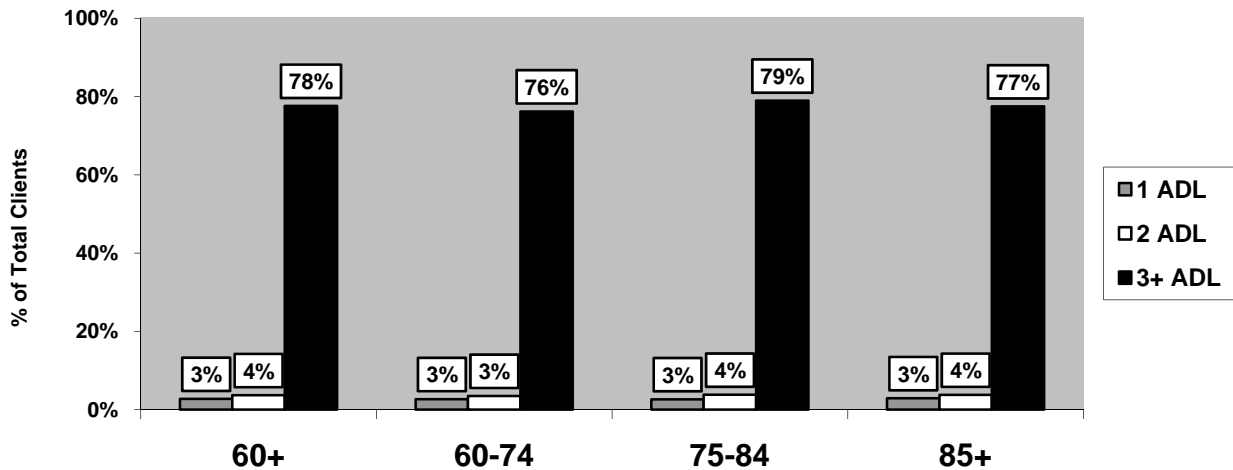
Chart 12: Unduplicated Clients by Income Level and % of Total Clients for each Age Group

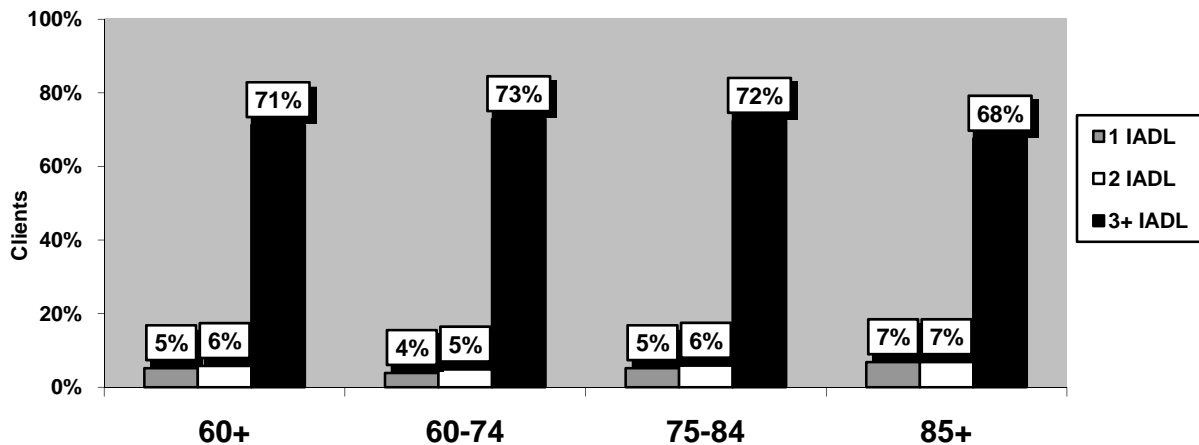

The majority of all age groups had 3 or more Impairments in Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADL).

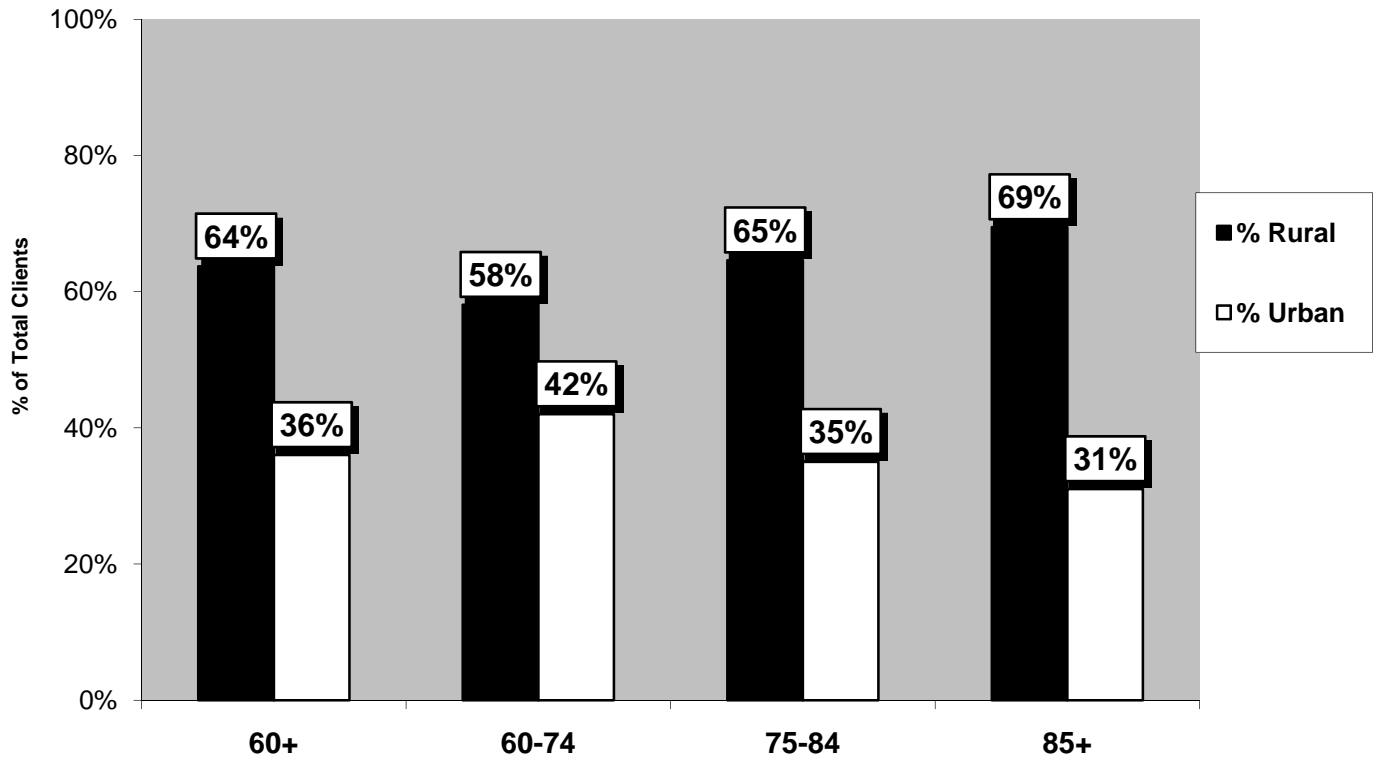

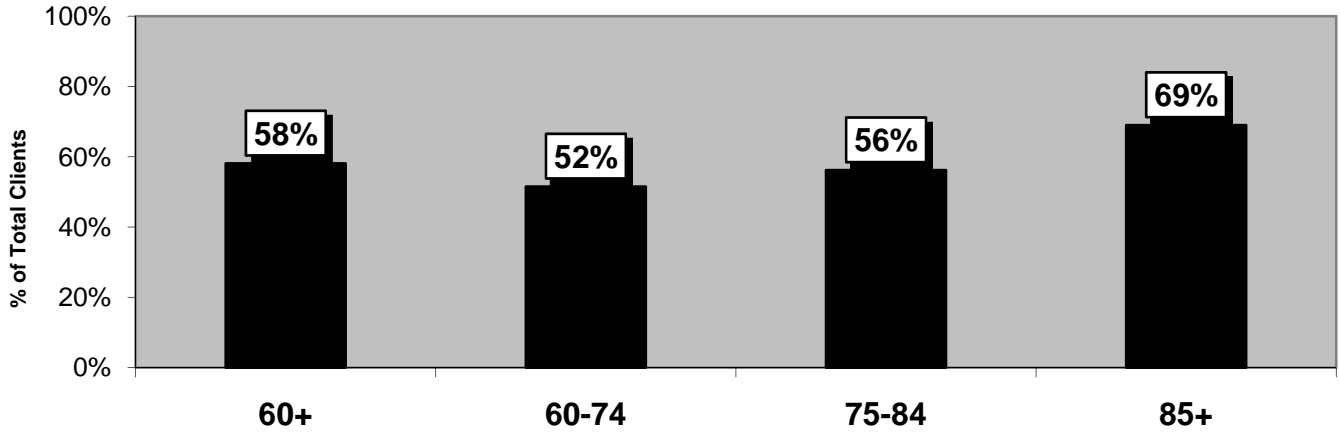

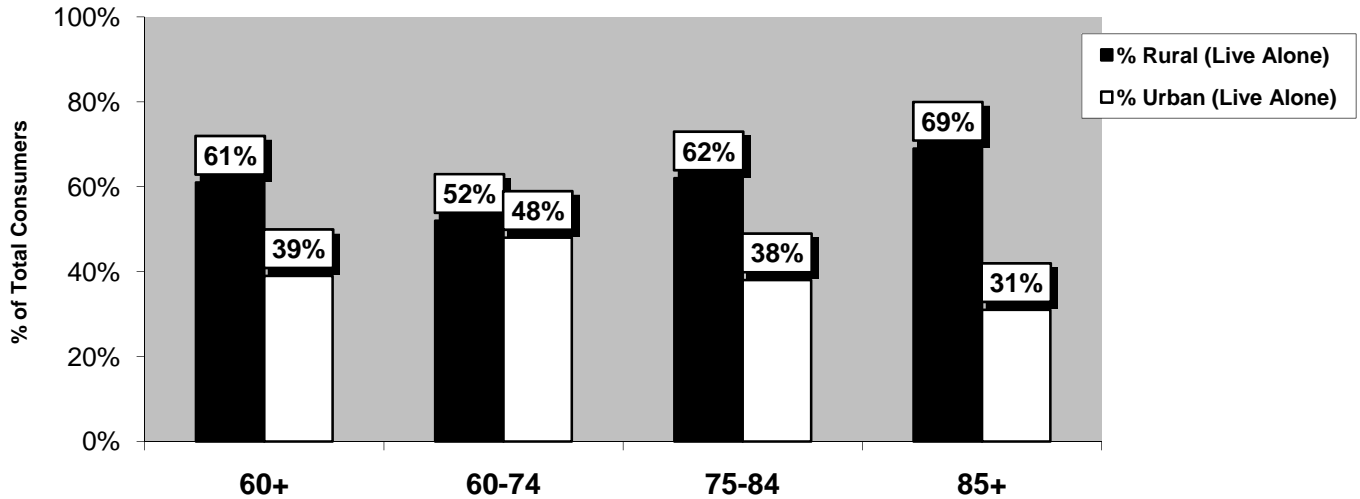
SFY 2010 Client Characteristics - Age Group and Living Alone Status

Chart 18: Congregate & Home Delivered Meal Unduplicated Client Counts 2007-2010

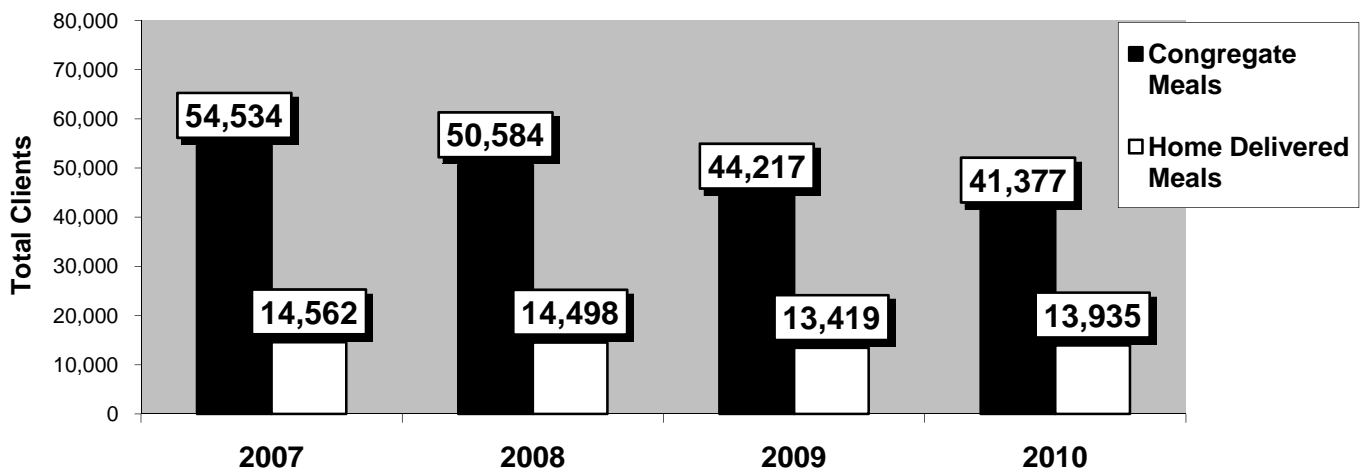
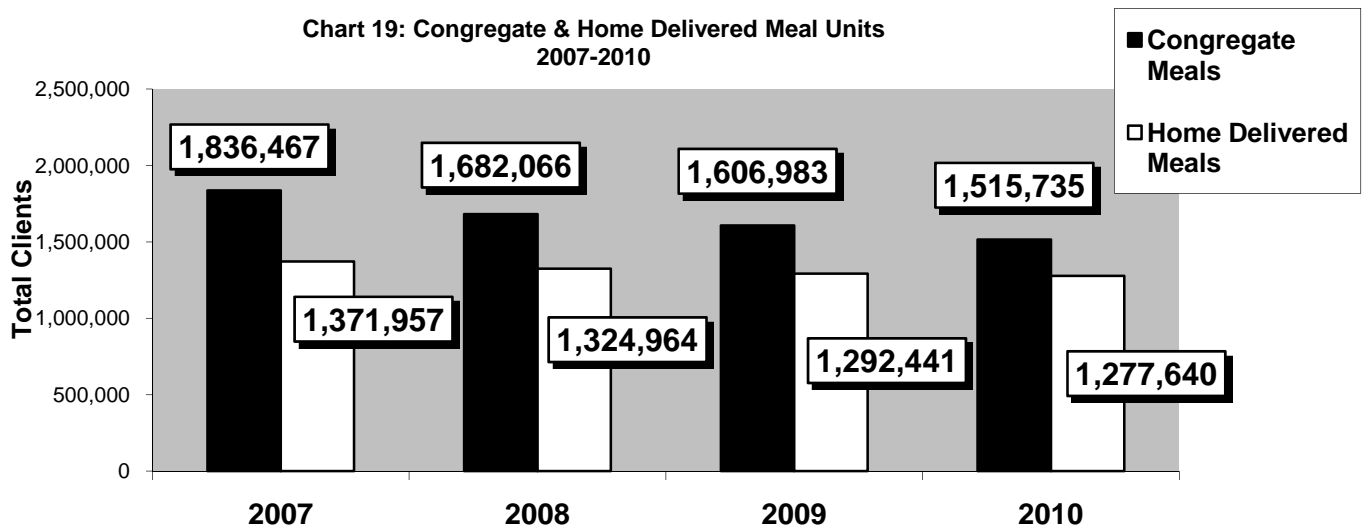


Chart 19: Congregate & Home Delivered Meal Units 2007-2010

% of High Nutrition Risk for each Age Group

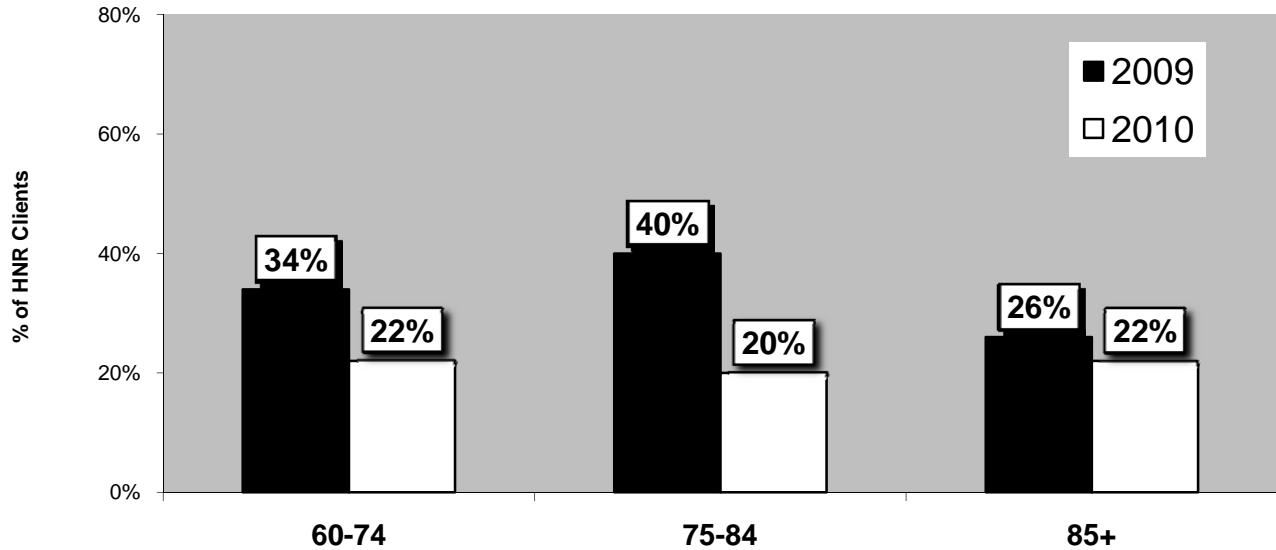
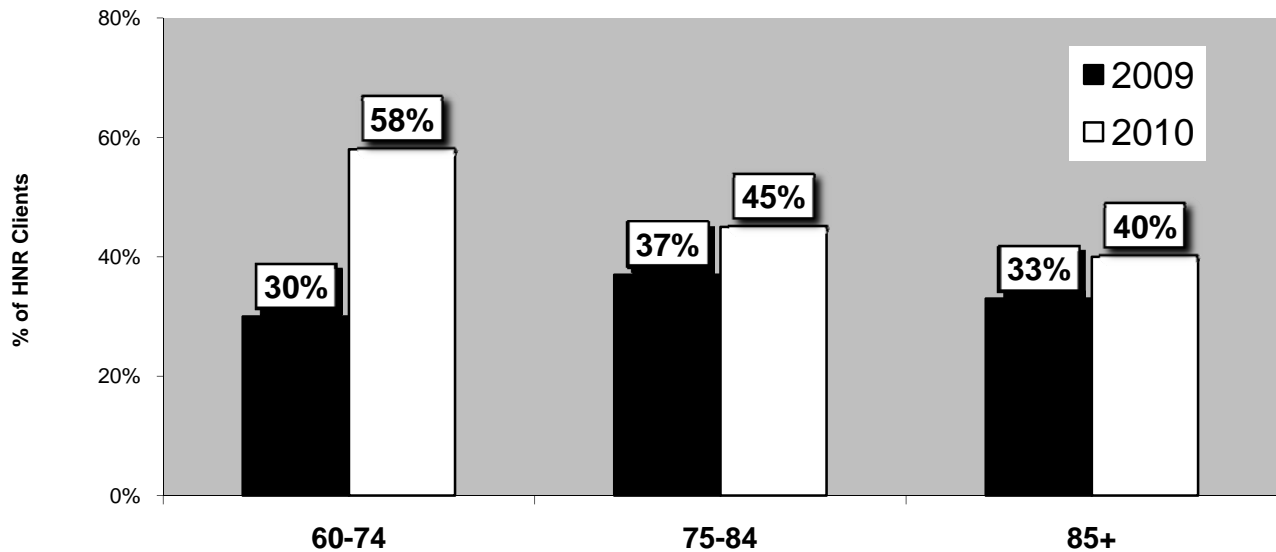


Chart 21: Home Delivered Meals

 % of High Nutrition Risk for each Age Group

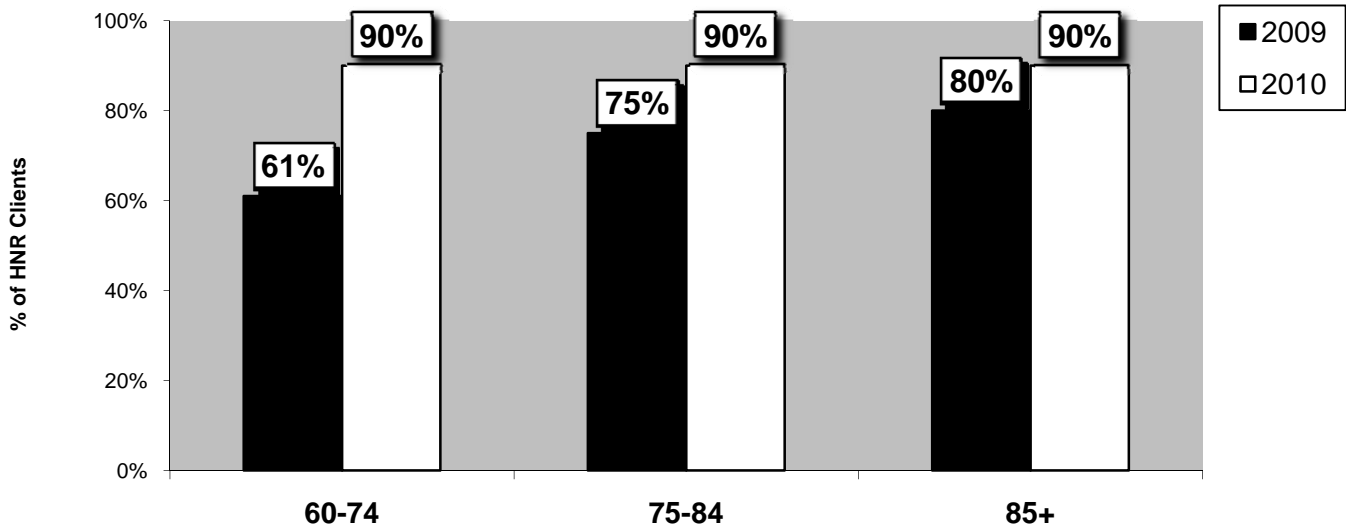
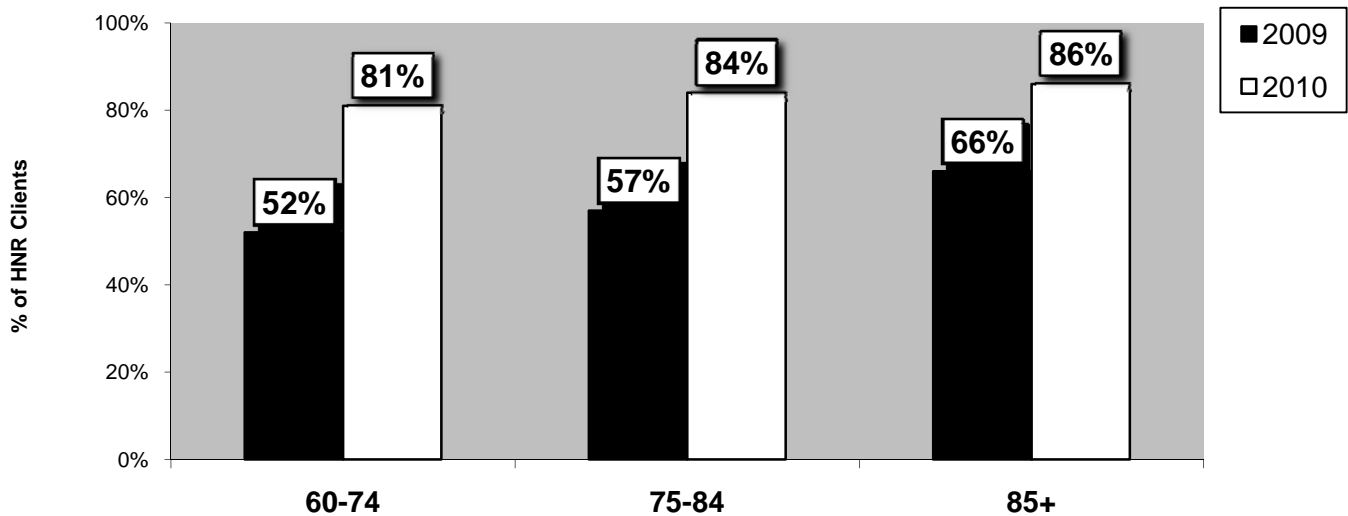


Chart 23: Home Delivered Meal Clients 3+ ADLS

% of High Nutrition Risk for each Age Group

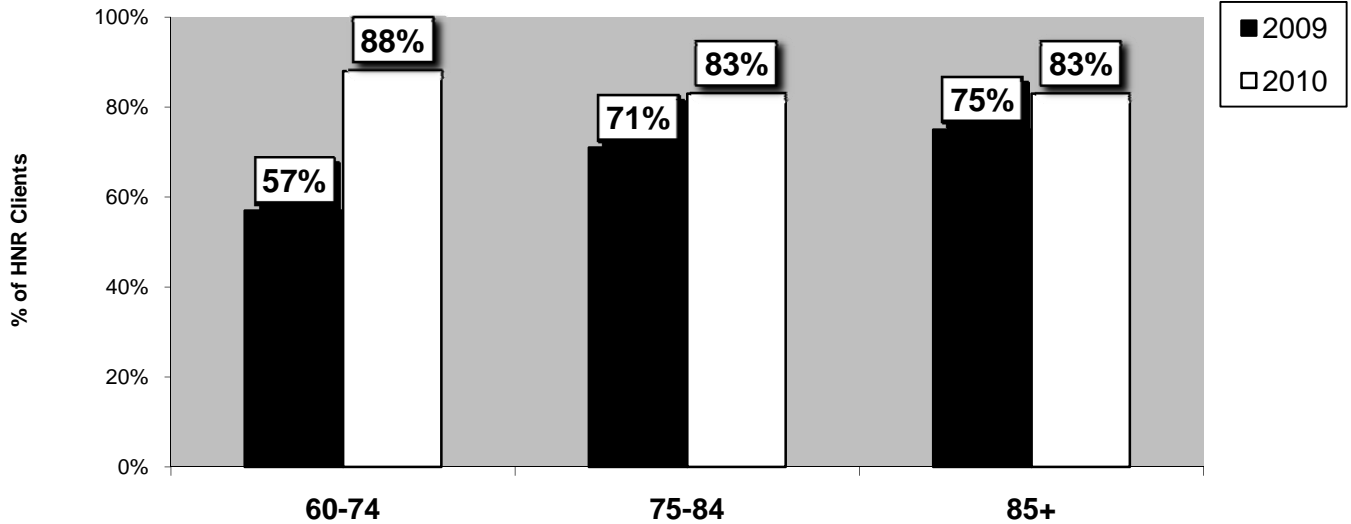
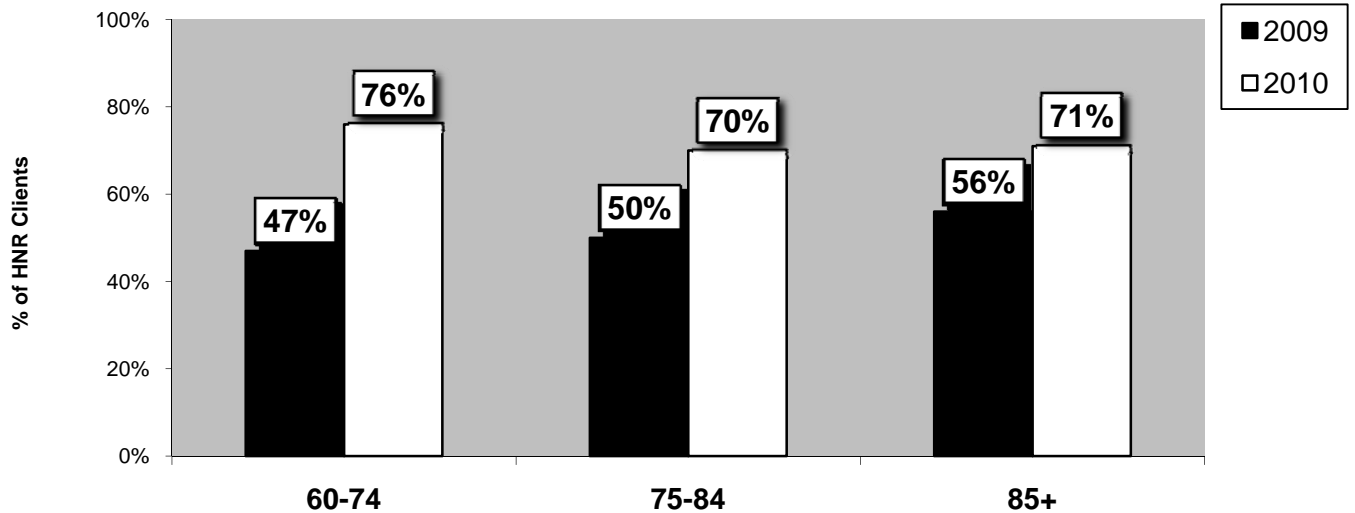


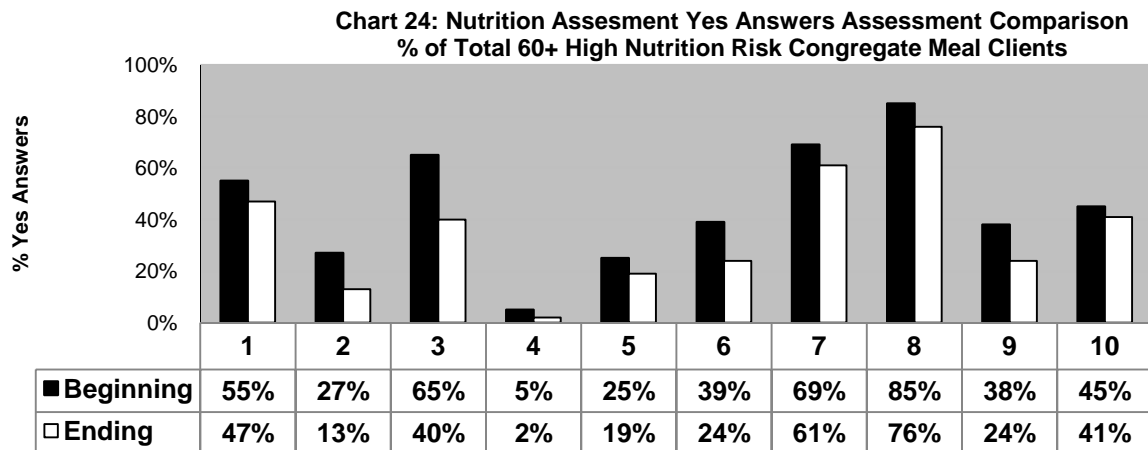
Chart 23: Home Delivered Meal Clients 3+ IADLS
% of High Nutrition Risk for each Age Group



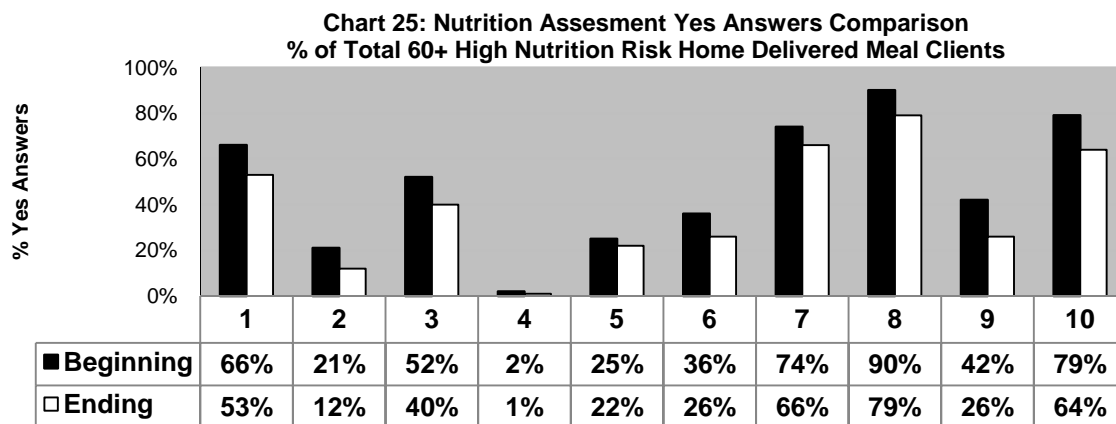

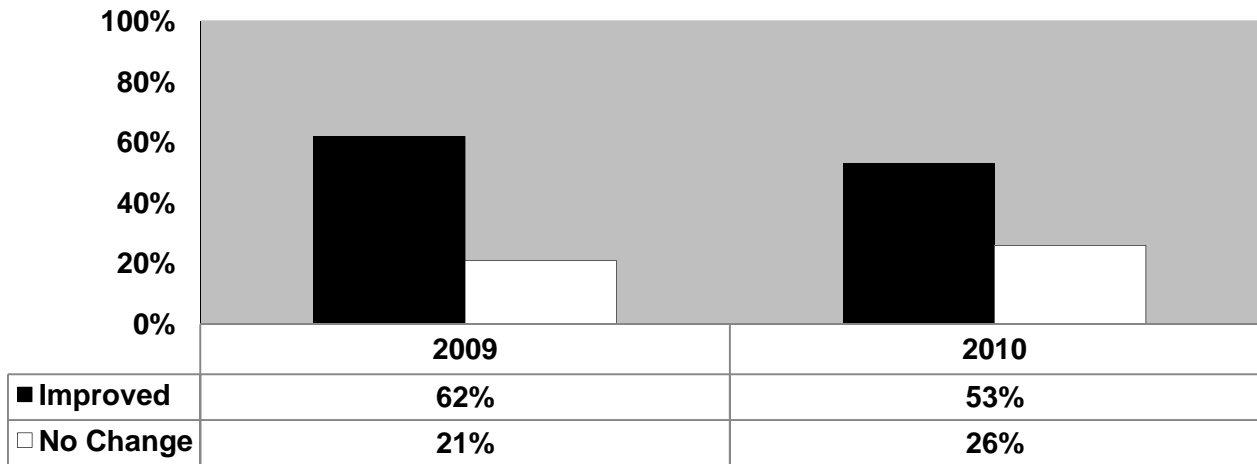

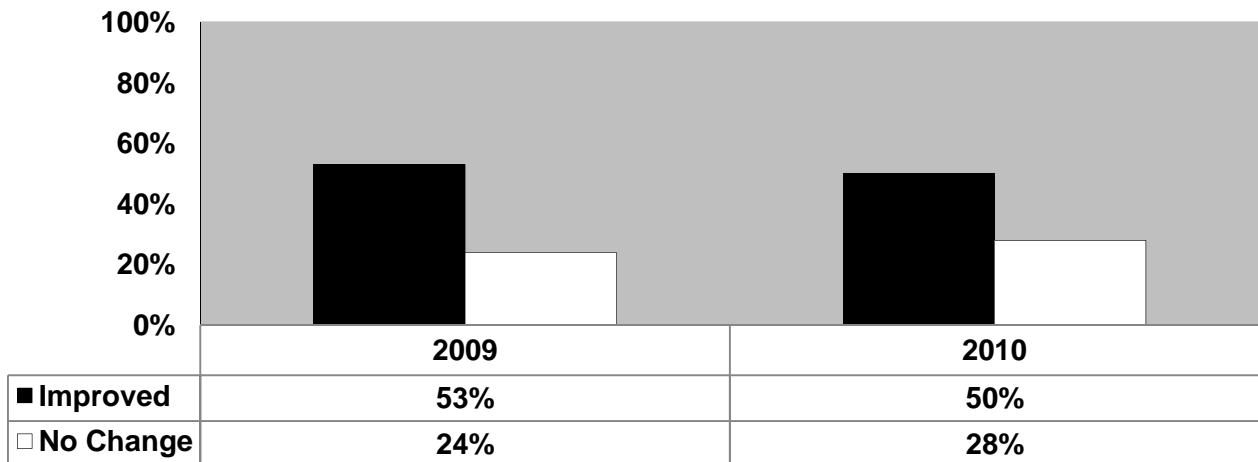
